## HEALTH CARE MANAGEMENT ACADEMIC MAP (Effective Summer 2018)

This map is a term-by-term sample course schedule. The milestones listed to the right of each term are designed to keep you on course to graduate in four years. The Sample Schedule serves as a general guideline to help you build a full schedule each term. The Liberal Arts and Humanities Elective courses must be selected to satisfy all area, literature, lab, and multicultural requirements unless your program meets these requirements with major courses. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. Missing milestones will result in one of two types of map registration stops. The first level (*Degree Map Off-track*) is placed following grade posting if the student has missed a milestone (course and/or GPA) for the first time in the major. If a student is in non-compliance with milestones for two (2) consecutive semesters (excluding summers), *a Major Change Required* stop is placed on the student's registration.

Healthcare management is a profession that utilizes principles, concepts and practices of the science of management to provide executive and operational leadership for health services facilities and programs. A health care manager plans, organizes, directs, coordinates and controls the resources of healthcare organizations. The undergraduate major in Health Care Management provides a foundation in the area of health care management and will prepare the student for an entry level career in health administration or for continuing on to graduate study.

To declare Health Care Management as your major, you must have successfully completed at least 60 credit hours, have earned a grade of "C" or better in the General Education Requirement courses.
